



Mr. Charles "Chuck" Sheridan Frazier

A celebration of the life of Mr. Charles "Chuck" Sheridan Frazier, 74, who entered into rest on Tuesday, July 21, 2020, will be held at a later date.

Mr. Frazier was born in Orwell, VT, a son of the late Delbert Frazier and Loretta Barber Frazier. He was a Veteran of the Vietnam War. He loved racing modified stock cars on dirt, and in 1985, he was the first Track Champion - Dirt Modified, the first year Autodrome Grandy Track was open. Chuck raced all over New England and Canada (asphalt and dirt).

He was a Lifetime Member of the Membership National Sporting Clay Association. He introduced his son, Scott, to racing at an early age and even traveled and competed in several R. C. racing events.

In 2015, he was inducted into the Clay Shooting Hall of Fame, receiving the Hal du Pont Award. Chuck was an avid gardener, and his favorite place to be was home on the farm where he owned and operated Chuck's Sales Service & Rentals Clay Sport Shooting Business. He loved to cook for his long time companion, Diane, and especially enjoyed making homemade treats for their

dog, Gracie.

He is survived by his son, Scott and his wife, Jennifer Frazier, of Biddeford, ME; sister, Karla Dubrule, Glens Falls, NY.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his brothers, Gerald "Jed" Frazier, Delbert C. Frazier; sisters, Karen Frazier, Maxeda Frazier (Infant), Nancy Frazier, Loretta Bishop, Wendi Shackett.
